

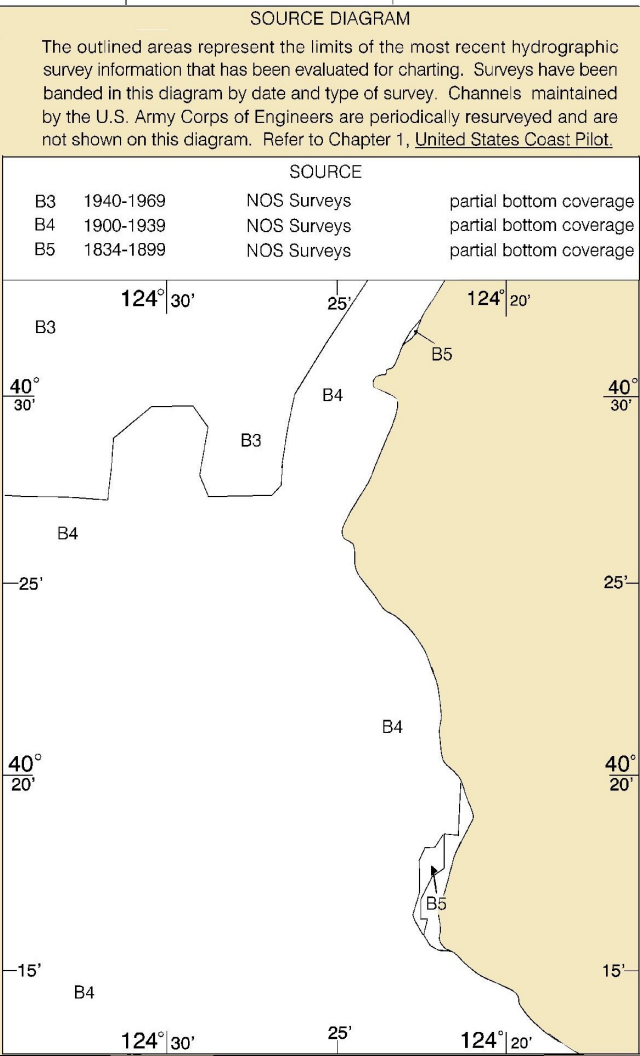

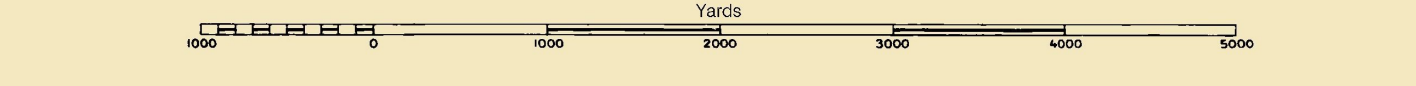
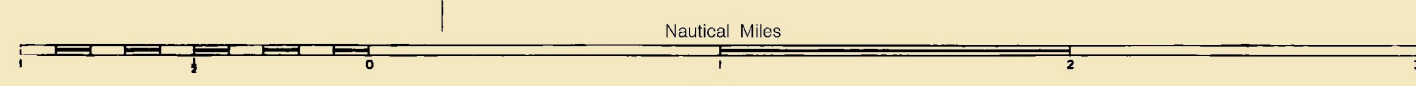

HORIZONTAL DATUM
The horizontal datum of this chart is North American Datum of 1983 (NAD 83), which for charting purposes is considered equivalent to the World Geodetic System 1984 (WGS 84). Geographic positions referred to the North American Datum of 1983 are corrected an average of 0.54" southward and 4.18" westward to agree with the chart.



To find SPEED, place one point of dividers on distance run in any unit and the other on minutes run. Without changing divider spread, place right point on 60 and left point on time in minutes per hour. Example: with 4.0 minutes run in 15 minutes, the speed is 16.0 knots.

NOTE B
Significant changes in offshore depths and shorelines between Cape Mendocino and Punta Gorda may have occurred as a result of the earthquake of 28 April 1992. Mariners are urged to use caution when navigating in the area.

POLLUTION REPORTS

RADAR REFLECTORS
Radar reflectors have been placed on many floating aids to navigation. Individual radar reflector identification on these aids has been omitted from this chart.

Temporary changes or defects in aids to navigation are not indicated on this chart. See Notice to Mariners.

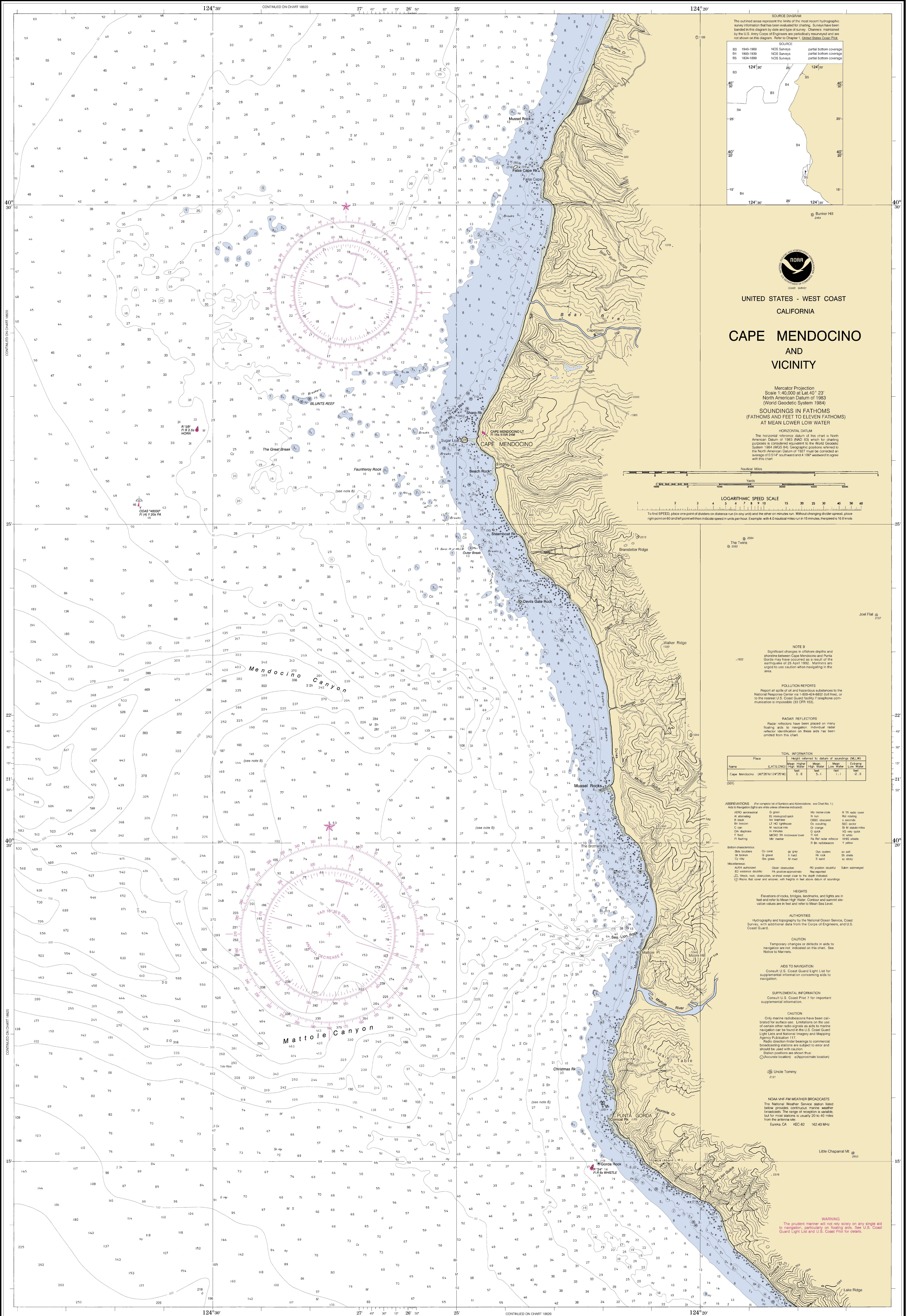
AIDS TO NAVIGATION

NOAA VHF-FM WEATHER BROADCASTS
The National Weather Service station listed below provides continuous marine weather broadcasts. The range of reception is variable, but for most stations is usually 20 to 40 miles from the antenna site.

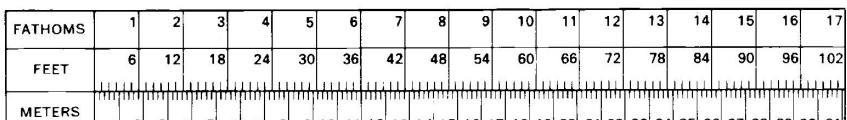
