*The Federal Interagency Working Group on Environmental Justice (IWG) was established in 1994 under Executive Order (EO) 12898. The IWG is comprised of federal agencies and several White House offices. Chaired by the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the IWG's focus is to integrate environmental justice into federal agency programs, policies and activities. In August 2011 the federal family reaffirmed its commitment to work for environmental justice and continue the collaborative work of the IWG. The IWG works to share lessons-learned and ensure opportunities for collaboration in ensure opportunities for collaboration in addressing environmental justice concerns.*

*The Environmental Justice Directory will serve as a resource for the public with a goal of increasing communication and collaboration among stakeholders, federal, state, and local agencies, and tribal governments to address environmental justice issues. Most importantly, this Directory will assist community stakeholders with obtaining better access to federal agencies in order to more effectively address environmental justice issues within their local communities.*
