The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 174, by a record vote of 6 to 5, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 1076, to prohibit Federal funding of National Public Radio and the use of Federal funds to acquire radio content, under a closed rule. The resolution provides one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Energy and Commerce. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution provides that the bill shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill. Finally, the resolution provides one motion to recommit.

EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

Although the rule waives all points of order against consideration of the bill, the Committee is not aware of any points of order. The waiver is prophylactic in nature.
