know the laws. Visit www.ohv.parks.ca.gov for more information. (Note: CVC denotes California Vehicle Code.)
Recreational Off-Highway Vehicle (ROV) Laws. A person operating an ROV shall be at least
16 years of age or be directly supervised in the vehicle by a parent or guardian or by an adult authorized by
(CVC 38600).
Safety helmets are required for operators and
passengers of ROVs (CVC 38601).
A seatbelt and shoulder belt or safety harness are required to be wor when an ROV is in
motion (CVC 38602).
Passengers must be seated in a location
designed and provided by the designed and provided by the manufacturer
in an R ROV with a model year of 2014 or later (CVC 38603(a)).
Passengers in Rovs must be able to grasp the handhold while properly restrained with th
back against the seatback (CVC 38604(a)).
Ability to Reach and Operate Controls. The Abinty to Reach and Operate Controls. The
operator of an off-highway motor vehicle shall be operator of an off-highway motor venicle shall be
able to reach and operate all controls necessary to
safely yperate the vehicle (CVC 38304 ). safely operate the vehicle (CVC 38304).

license status is against the law (CVC 14601). Speed Laws.

the recreation site. Upon arrival to the ISD permits must be purchased and properly displayed in/on the windshield. Permits are nonrefundable. Saving Spaces. Sav.
space is prohibited.

Safety Flags. OHVs shall be equipped with a whip mast and a $6 \times 12$-inch red/orange flag.
Masts must be mounted on the vehicle and Masts must be mounted on the vehicle and Fires. Burning potentially hazardous materials,
including, but not limited to, gas, oil, plastic, and including, but not limited to, gas, oil, plastic, a
magnesium, is prohibited.
Wood Pallets. Firewood materials containing nails, screws, or other metal hardware are

Glass Beverage Containers. Possession of glass
beverage containers is beverage containers is prohibited.
Alcoholic Beverages. It is prohibited to drink or possess alcoholic beverages, including open
containers, while operating a motor vehicle containers, while operating a motor vehicle or
