Bond SwampNational Wildlife Refuge is located along the Ocmulgee River in Bibb and Twiggs counties, approximately six miles south of Macon. The Refuge was established in 1989 to protect, maintain and enhance the ecosystem of the Ocmulgee River floodplain. The Refuge currently consists of 6,500 acres situated along the fall line separating the piedmont from the coastal plains region, and contains wetlands associated with the Ocmulgee River floodplain and some adjoining uplands. Please use caution as some roads may flood and become impassable to vehicles.

A Bird Haven

In order to preserve and protect a diverse, threatened wetland ecosystem, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service purchased approximately 5,400 acres in 1989 to establish Bond Swamp National Wildlife Refuge. The area is rich in wildlife diversity and provides optimal habitat for a large variety of nesting, migrating, and wintering birds. Many of these species are neotropical migrants whose populations have been declining due to the phenomenal loss of forested wetlands. Bond Swamp NWR's objectives are to preserve the wetlands which serve as habitat for endangered species, migratory birds, and native wildlife and to provide compatible, wildlife related educational and recreational opportunities for the general public.



Viewing Tips

The observation of birds in their natural habitat is becoming an increasingly popular recreational activity. Viewing entertainment can be greatly enhanced if binoculars or a spotting scope is used.

This equipment assists in bird identification and enables one to observe the birds from a distance, thus minimizing disturbance. Birds are most active during the early morning and late afternoon periods, so this is the best time to birdwatch.

Except for a short time during managed deer and hog hunts, most of the refuge is open for bird watching. Please call for hunt dates. Access to the refuge is accomplished by three hiking trails and a road system. Parking is available at the Stone Creek Kiosk and the Longleaf Pine Trail parking lots. During wet seasons of the year, accessibility may be limited or prohibited due to flooding.

Besides U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service personnel, reliable volunteers in the field have contributed many of the observations. This list will be updated periodically to include new sightings or changes.
