Mr. McLeod, from the Committee on the District of Columbia, submitted the following

REPORT

[To accompany H. R. 10204]

The Committee on the District of Columbia, to which was referred the bill (H. R. 10204) providing an additional wing to the District Jail, having considered the same, report it back to the House with the following amendment:

Add a period after the word "floor" in line 6 and strike out the remainder of the sentence, with the recommendation that the amend-

ment be agreed to and the bill do pass.

Members of the committee made an investigation of the District Jail while this bill was under consideration and were convinced that the relief sought to be provided from present overcrowded and insanitary conditions is necessary.

"The commissioners believe that the proposed legislation should be favorably considered when amended so as to provide for the authorization of an appropriation for not exceeding \$200,000 to be payable in like manner as other appropriations for the District of Columbia. * * * the commissioners request that they be advised whether the proposed authorization, which if enacted would be followed by a request for an appropriation, is in accord with the financial program of the President."
