The Committee on Foreign Relations, to whom was referred the bill (S. 68) authorizing Dominic I. Murphy, consul general of the United States, to accept a silver fruit bowl presented to him by the British Government, having considered the same, report thereon with the recommendation that the bill do pass.

During the recent war Mr. Murphy served as consul general of the United States at Sofia, Bulgaria. Many British prisoners of war were confined in Bulgaria, in whose welfare Mr. Murphy took a deep interest, and in recognition of the relief and assistance which he had rendered to these British prisoners the gift referred to was tendered him by the British Government on November 11, 1918.
