REPORT

[To accompany H. J. Res. 298]

The Committee on Military Affairs, to which was referred the joint resolution authorizing the Secretary of War to lend 700 cots and 700 blankets for the use of the North Carolina Department of the American Legion at its annual convention at Washington, N. C., in August, 1927, having considered the same, report favorably thereon with the recommendation that the resolution be passed.

This is a resolution to permit the Secretary of War to lend certain Army equipment to a post of the American Legion for use in connection with a State convention. It is in the usual form and has the usual proviso protecting the Government against loss.
