REPORT

[To accompany H. J. Res. 292]

The Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce, to whom was referred the resolution (H. J. Res. 292) to amend the act entitled "An act granting the consent of Congress for the construction of a bridge across the Delaware River at or near Burlington, N. J.," approved May 21, 1926, having considered the same, report thereon with a recommendation that it pass.

The bill has the approval of the War and Agriculture Departments, as will appear by the letters attached and which are made a part of this report.

DEAR MR. PARKER: Careful consideration has been given to the resolution (H. J. Res. 292) transmitted with your letter of December 8 with request for a report thereon and such views relative thereto as the department might desire to communicate.

This resolution would amend the act entitled "An act granting the consent of Congress for the construction of a bridge across the Delaware River at or near Burlington, N. J.," approved May 21, 1926, United States Statutes at Large, page 588, by striking out the name "Clifford A. Anderson" wherever it occurs in such act and inserting in lieu thereof the name "Clifford L. Anderson." The resolution is without objection so far as this department is concerned.
