Mr. Borah, from the Committee on Foreign Relations, submitted the following

REPORT

[To accompany S. Res. 366]

The Senate Committee on Foreign Relations, having had under consideration Senate Resolution 366, reports the same with the following amendments:

After the word "authorized," in line 3, strike out the words "to investigate and study conditions and policies bearing upon the relationship between the Central American countries, Mexico, and the United States. For the purposes of this resolution the committee or subcommittee thereof is authorized to visit such countries."

or subcommittee thereof is authorized to visit such countries".

After the word "places", in line 8, insert "within the United States", so that, as amended, the resolution will read as follows:

Resolved, That the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations, or any duly authorized subcommittee thereof, is hereby authorized to sit during the recess of Congress and at such times and places within the United States, to employ such clerical, stenographic, or other assistance, to require the attendance of such witnesses and the production of such documents and papers, to administer such oaths, to take such testimony and make such expenditures as it deems advisable. The expenses of the committee, or subcommittee, which shall not exceed \$10,000 shall be paid out of the contingent fund of the Senate.

The committee recommends that the resolution, as amended, do pass.
