DRAFT OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION TO EXTEND THE AVAILABILITY OF THE UNEXPENDED BALANCE OF THE APPROPRIATION OF \$50,000 FOR EXTRAORDINARY REPAIRS AND REFURNISHINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE MANSION

Sir: I have the honor to transmit herewith for the consideration of Congress a draft of proposed legislation to extend the availability of the unexpended balance of the appropriation of \$50,000 for extraordinary repairs and refurnishing of the Executive Mansion carried in the appropriation act for the Executive Office and independent establishments for the fiscal year 1926, approved March 3, 1925.

The purpose of this legislation is set forth in the letter of the Director of the Bureau of the Budget, transmitted herewith, with whose comments and recommendation thereon I concur.

Sir: I have the honor to submit herewith for your consideration a draft of proposed legislation affecting an existing appropriation as follows:

The appropriation for the fiscal year 1926 for extraordinary repairs to and refurnishing of the Executive Mansion contained in the act approved March 3, 1925, is hereby continued available during the fiscal year 1927.

The act of March 3, 1925, making appropriations for the Executive Office and independent establishments for the fiscal year 1926 carried an appropriation of \$50,000 for extraordinary repairs and

refurnishing of the Executive Mansion.

Of this amount there had been expended and obligated to June 30, 1926, \$43,155.91. Authority to use the unexpended balance of \$6,844.09 during the fiscal year 1927 is necessary in order that the repairs and refurnishing contemplated may be carried to completion. I recommend that the above draft of proposed legislation be transmitted to Congress.
