

INCREASING THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS
NATIONAL HOME FOR DISABLED VOLUNTEER SOLDIERS

submitted the following

REPORT

[To accompany H. J. Res. 370]

The Committee on Military Affairs, to whom was referred House Joint Resolution 370, increasing the membership of the Board of Managers of the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, and appointing certain members of the board, having considered the same, report thereon with the recommendation that it do pass.

This is a resolution drawn in the usual form, providing for the appointment of members of the Board of Managers of the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers of the United States to fill vacancies. The resolution also carries an amendment to the Revised Statutes providing that the Board of Managers shall be composed of nine members instead of seven as at present. This amendment will permit the naming of two additional members, both of whom are from the two Southern States where homes are located, namely, Virginia and Tennessee.

In order that the Board of Managers may function properly, your committee earnestly recommends that this measure be enacted before the close of this Congress.
