REPORT :

The Committee on Revolutionary Pensions. to whom was referred the petition of Samuel Byxbe, have examined the same, and report:

The petitioner alleges that he provided himself with a wagon and team, and was, on several occasions, during the revolutionary war, employed in the transportation of military stores. He also represents that he was paid off in continental currency, at its par value, when it had greatly depreciated.

The committee are of opinion that the pension laws do no embrace the class of service in which the petitioner was employed, and therefore report against his petition.
