To the House of Representatives of the United States:

I transmit herewith a communication from the Secretary of the Treasury, which presents for the consideration of Congress the propriety of so changing the 2d section of the act of March 2, 1837, as that the existing humane provisions of the laws for the relief of certain insolvent debtors of the United States may be extended to such cases of insolvency as shall have occurred on or before the 1st day of January, 1839.

SIR: By an act of Congress, approved March 2, 1837, entitled "An act to extend for a longer period the several acts now in force for the relief of certain insolvent debtors of the United States," the provisions of the said several acts were made to apply to such cases of insolvency as occurred on or before the 1st day of January, 1837.
