REPORT:

*The Committee of Claims, to which was referred a resolution asking compensation for a horse lost the 4th of May, 1818, by John B. Perkins, a private in Captain J. Rodgers's company, while in the military service of the United States, in a campaign against the Seminole Indians, report:*

That said Perkins was a private in Captain James Rodgers's company, in 1818, against the Seminole Indians; that on the 4th of May he lost a horse, for want of forage, valued at ninety-five dollars, as appears from the certificate of the captain of the company; said Perkins swears he never received any compensation, or any other horse or mare in lieu of his lost horse. The committee think him entitled to relief, and report a bill accordingly.
