

LEAD MINES—UPPER MISSISSIPPI.

LETTER

FROM

THE SECRETARY OF WAR,

TRANSMITTING

A report of the officer in charge of the Ordnance bureau, relative to the lead mines on the upper Mississippi.

FEBRUARY 16, 1843.

Referred to the Committee on the Public Lands.

WAR DEPARTMENT, *February 16, 1843.*

SIR: In compliance with a resolution of the House of Representatives of the 9th instant, relative to the lead mines on the upper Mississippi, I transmit, herewith, a report of the officer in charge of the Ordnance bureau.

In addition thereto, I have to remark that the difficulties in which the superintendent was involved in July last, as they appeared from his communications and other sources of information, were so formidable as to satisfy me that either the agency must be abandoned, and with it all effort to obtain the just dues of the Government, or the superintendent must be reinforced and sustained by additional aid.

A correct view of the magnitude and extent of these difficulties, arising from the number, power, and influence of those who had made illegal, and, in many cases, fraudulent entries, cannot be had without a knowledge of the names of those who made these entries. All these persons considered themselves interested in baffling the exertions of the agent to repossess the mineral lands for their true owner, and most of them were actively engaged in constant efforts to accomplish that object.

Deeming it, therefore, essential to a correct understanding of the case, I transmit, herewith, five schedules and reports, marked A, B, C, D, and E, certified by Levi Sterling, receiver of the land office at Muskoday, exhibiting the entries for mineral lands reserved from sale, the several tracts entered, and the names of the persons making the entries.

ORDNANCE OFFICE,

Washington, February 16, 1843.

SIR: In reply to the resolution of the House of Representatives of the 9th instant, calling for certain information in relation to the Government agency of the lead mines on the upper Mississippi, and which resolution has been referred by you to this office, I have the honor to report:

First. That there is now in the employment of the United States, at the agency, one superintendent, at a salary of one thousand dollars per annum, and fifteen per centum on such portion of the rent lead collected as he may have shipped to the commanding officer of the United States arsenal at St. Louis.

One agent in charge of the office at Galena, with whom the superintendent consults in granting leases, &c., who keeps all the accounts, and makes the necessary periodical returns to this office. The compensation of this agent is one hundred dollars per month.

One clerk employed in the office, at the rate of five hundred dollars per annum.

These are all the individuals employed in the agency. Others have been temporarily employed, from time to time, by the superintendent and agent, in copying such plats and records from the land offices as were indispensable in the business of the agency, and in locating leases where conflicting claims rendered it necessary; and counsel has also been employed in some cases by these officers, to protect the rights of the United States which were brought into dispute in the local courts by suits of pre-emption claimants against the lessees. No other persons are known to have been employed. It may be proper, however, to add, that it is made the duty of Captain William H. Bell, of the Ordnance department, commanding the St. Louis arsenal, to visit this region occasionally, to supervise the agency, and to report such matters as he deems it proper to bring to the notice of the Government.

The total amount shown, by the books of this office, to have been paid since the establishment of the present agency, in 1841, up to the 31st December last, exclusive of the compensation of the superintendent and agent above mentioned, is fifteen hundred and sixty-four dollars and thirty-four cents.

These expenditures have been paid out of the appropriation for the "current expenses of the ordnance service;" from which appropriation all the expenses of the former agencies, from the first appointment in 1821, have been paid.

Second. The amount of rents which have been collected on leases granted since the establishment of the present agency at Galena, in 1841, to the 31st December last, has been 74,924 pounds of lead, and no portion of the rents due on those leases has been paid in money. It is proper to state, however, that the sum of \$1,808 14 in cash, and 62,970 pounds of lead, have been received for old balances due prior to 1841.

As erroneous views of the importance of this agency will, however, be likely to arise from the foregoing answers to the queries embraced in the resolution, without further explanations, I beg leave to connect with it a brief statement of some of the causes which have prevented any thing like a just equivalent to the United States for the use of these mines, from 1834 up to the present time.

From the year 1821, when the control of these mines was transferred

from the Treasury to the War Department, and placed in the immediate control of this bureau, to the 30th September, 1834, the United States received for the rent of that portion of them then worked no less than 4,929,420 pounds of pure lead. An opinion then became prevalent among the miners and smelters, that no further claim for rent could be sustained, and payment was altogether refused. To counteract this impression, it became necessary to institute a suit against two of the most prominent delinquents, (Burton & Gratiot;) but this suit being carried up to the Supreme Court of the United States, it was not till the January term, 1840, that judgment was obtained in favor of the United States, so that operations could be renewed at the agency with any prospect of success. By this time, however, a new host of difficulties had arisen, from the mal-administration and disobedience of orders of the register and receiver of the land office at Mineral Point, and which has been the basis of most of the neglects and refusals of rent up to the present time.

That these transactions may appear in their proper light, it is necessary to remark, that the President of the United States, in his proclamation of 1834, for the sale of the lands in the Mineral Point land district, set forth that "all tracts of land in which lead mines or diggings are indicated to exist by the official plats of survey, together with all such other tracts as, from satisfactory evidence to be adduced to the register of the land office prior to the date of sale, shall be shown to contain lead mines, shall be excluded from sale;" that the superintendent of the mines made lists of the sections and parts of sections which he had under lease or knew to contain mineral, and requested them to be reserved; that the Commissioner of the General Land Office, in communicating that list to the register and receiver, positively directed, in the name of the President, that they should be reserved, and called the attention of these officers again to the special directions of the proclamation; that many sections were noted on the plats of survey as containing mineral; that many others were reported, verbally and in writing, to the register and receiver, by individuals, as containing their diggings, or as being known by them to contain lead; that, notwithstanding all this, the whole lands were *cried* at the public sale; and when those thus reported as mineral, whether by the superintendent of the mines, by the plats of survey, or otherwise, were reached in the order of sale, they were withdrawn by the register from sale, on account of their mineral character; and yet, within a few months after, many of the same lots were allowed by this same register, John P. Sheldon, to be entered at the minimum price of \$1 25 per acre; and it is in evidence, by extracts from the records of the land office, that from that time to September, 1838, 640 entries of these lands were thus allowed to be made.

It is true that the non-mineral character of the lands was attempted to be proved, after they had been withdrawn from public sale, by leading men *blindfolded* over them, and then taking them to the land office to swear that they had been over the land sought to be entered, and could see no indications of mineral.

The list obtained from the land office at Muskoday, during the last summer, of the entries of these mineral lands, embrace the names of persons of the highest standing in the Territory—delegates in Congress, judges, justices—in fact, the most influential men of that region; while others, as well there as in Illinois and Iowa, set up pre-emption claims in the same manner as though the land had not been reserved. Laws were passed by the

local legislatures, making certificates of entry evidence of title. Suits were instituted not only by the holders of certificates, but by pre-emption claimants, against the lessees, for trespass, and for large per centages of their diggings.

It was in this state of affairs that, after the decision in the case of Burton & Gratiot, in August, 1840, Dr. Henry King was appointed by the then Secretary of War, Mr. Poinsett, to visit the lead mine country, and report a plan for the sale of the mineral lands, as well as a plan for the improvement of the mining operations. He visited the country accordingly, and reported upon the condition of affairs, but resigned his appointment in May, 1841, whereupon the present superintendent, Mr. Flanagan, was appointed by the late Secretary, Mr. Bell. So completely, however, had the rights of the United States been resisted by the measures hereinbefore mentioned, that no lease was taken from him till May, 1842; and since then the lessees have not only been harassed by suits in the justices' courts for trespass, but they have been driven off in some cases by armed men.

The immense labor which this condition of things imposed upon the superintendent, as well as the high degree of judgment required to decide whether it was advisable to grant a lease for the land asked, and to which of the several persons that in some cases applied for the same land, induced, in July last, the employment of an additional agent, to advise and act in conjunction with the superintendent in all such cases, and to relieve him from the charge of the records and returns, and General Cunningham was accordingly employed.

I have thus endeavored to account for the employment of the persons named, as well as for the small amount of rent collected since the establishment of the present agency; but, in order to show the immense loss to the United States which has been caused by the illegal possession taken of these mines, reference may be had to a very valuable and elaborate report received from Captain Bell, the supervising officer already referred to, but which report did not reach here in time to be used in making my annual report to you of 1st November last.

The captain gives, among other things, a table, drawn up from the best sources of information, which shows that, from the year 1834, when payment of rent to the United States was first resisted, to 1842, inclusive, no less than 218,251,605 pounds of lead was made from these mines; and that, at the established rate of rent, at 6 per cent., this should have yielded to the United States 13,095,096 pounds.

He further states, that there are many valuable copper mines known to be scattered through the mineral region of Wisconsin, though but few of them have yet been wrought, the ores from which have been found to yield from 23 to 35 per cent.; and that one of these mines, in the vicinity of Mineral Point, yielded, from 1st March to 1st September last, 300,000 pounds of ore, from the labor of six men.

I cannot close this report without again referring to the extent and importance of the labors of this agency. So long as these lands are not brought into market, and the want of effective legislation on the subject continues, the most valuable mines being nearly all held either by the illegal entries above referred to or by those who pretend to rights of pre-emption, only the less valuable have been attempted to be leased, and yet no less than six hundred and ten leases were taken from 1st May to 31st of December last. These give employment to about three thousand miners, and had

yielded, up to 30th of November, (the date of the last return,) 4,361,293 pounds of mineral, on which there then remained a balance of 94,778 pounds of lead due the United States as rent. The yield would no doubt have been much greater, and the balance would have been nearly all paid, but for the suits instituted against them by individuals, as above mentioned. It is also the duty of the agency, as far as practicable, to collect the balances due on old leases and licenses prior to September 30, 1834, as well as rent for the mineral raised from that time to the recommencement of operations, in May, 1842.

It is estimated that at least three thousand other miners are engaged in working the mines held by individuals, to whom they pay, in many instances, as high as twenty-five per cent. on the product of their diggings.
