REPORT:

The Committee on Revolutionary Claims, to whom was referred the petition of Richard De Treville, Ellis, Caroline, Elizabeth, Harriet De Treville, and Samuel Lawrence, legal representatives of Captain John De Treville, a captain of artillery in the continental army, report:

That satisfactory proof has been offered to sustain the facts alleged in the memorial, and your committee have been led to a favorable conclusion on the merits of this case, in common with two previous committees of this House. They are satisfied that Captain John De Treville was a highly meritorious officer; that he never had received the benefit of the resolves of Congress granting commutation to those who should serve throughout the war, and that the parties claimants are the legal heirs and representatives of Captain De Treville. They report a bill for their relief.
