JOINT RESOLUTIONS of instructions to our senators and representatives in Congress in relation to pensions to widows of deceased chaplains and surgeons in the army.

Be it resolved by the senate and house of representatives of the State of Iowa, That our senators in Congress are instructed, and our representatives requested, to use their influence to procure the passage of an amendment to the pension laws of the United States allowing pensions to the widows of chaplains and surgeons in the army who die or may be killed while in the service of the United States. *Resolved*, That the secretary of state forward copies of this joint resolution

to each of our senators and representatives in Congress.
