Successful applicants receive a paid, 8-week summer position with APHIS at one of our offices around the country. It's a chance to gain valuable professional experience working for a Federal agency.

What Does an Intern Do?

Based on career interests and skills, our interns work with one of APHIS' programs—Animal Care, Biotechnology Regulatory Services, International Services, Plant Protection and Quarantine, Veterinary Services, or Wildlife Services—or one of our management support units. You'll assist with daily operations and get first-hand experience in such areas as field work, laboratory research, administration, data analysis, budget and accounting, communications and outreach, and other technical and scientific work in agricultural health.
