## REPORT.

The Committee on Naval Affairs, to whom was referred the memorial of Sarah F. Anderson, the surviving widow of Dr. Thomas P. Anderson, who was regularly commissioned as a surgeon, and served in the navy of the late republic of Texas for several years previously and up to the period of annexation to the United States, and who departed this life near the close of the year 1847, leaving his family with limited means of support or education, report:

That an act was passed and approved March 3, 1857, as follows:

SEC. 12. And be it further enacted, That the surviving officers of the navy of the republic of Texas, who were duly commissioned as such at the time of annexation, shall be entitled to the pay of officers of like grades, when waiting orders in the navy of the United States, for five years from the time of said annexation, and a sum sufficient to make the payment is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated: Provided, That the acceptance of the provisions of this act by any officer shall be a full relinquishment and renunciation of all claim, on his part, to any further compensation on this behalf from the United States government, and to any position in the navy of the United States.
