SIR: I have the honor to submit herewith for your consideration a supplemental estimate of appropriation for the Navy Department for the fiscal year 1939, amounting to \$47,000, as follows:

Contingent, Bureau of Yards and Docks: For an additional amount for contingent expenses, and so forth, including the same objects specified under this head in the act making appropriation for the Navy Department and the naval service for the fiscal year 1939 (52 Stat. 238)

This estimate of appropriation is necessary to cover the cost of a topographic and hydrographic survey of certain proposed naval air bases recommended in the report of the Hepburn Board printed as House Document No. 65, Seventy-sixth Congress, first session. The information to be obtained from these surveys is needed at the earliest practicable date.

This estimate of appropriation is required to meet contingencies which have arisen since the transmission of the Budget for the fiscal year 1939. I recommend that it be transmitted to Congress.
