

RESOLUTION

OF THE

LEGISLATURE OF CALIFORNIA,

In relation to the transmission of the mail from San Francisco to Sacramento.

MARCH 2, 1860.—Referred to the Committee on Post Offices and Post Roads, and ordered to be printed.

Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That our senators in Congress be instructed, and our members requested, to use their best endeavors to procure the establishment of a Sunday mail from San Francisco to Sacramento, on occasions when the mail shall arrive by sea or overland at the former city on Saturday night or Sunday morning.

Resolved, That the governor be requested to forward copies of the above resolution to our senators and members in Congress.
