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

SPIRIT LEVELING IN NORTH CAROLINA, 1896 TO 1914, INCLUSIVE.

INTRODUCTION.

Cooperation.—The State of North Carolina contributed financially to the work in 1896 and from 1902 to 1910, inclusive.

Previous publication.—That portion of the results of spirit leveling in North Carolina previously published in Bulletin 441, containing descriptions and elevations of bench marks established from 1896 to 1909, inclusive, and based on the 1903 adjustment, has been corrected to agree with the 1912 adjustment of precise leveling of the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey, and is here republished, together with the results of spirit leveling by the United States Geological Survey in North Carolina since 1909.

Personnel.—The field work from 1896 to 1906, inclusive, was done under the direction of H. M. Wilson, geographer, and that from 1907 to 1914, inclusive, was done under Frank Sutton, geographer. The work since January, 1908, was done under the general direction of R. B. Marshall, chief geographer. Credit is given in the headings of the several lists to the respective levelmen. The office work of computation, adjustment, and preparation of lists was done mainly by S. S. Gannett, geographer, under the general direction of E. M. Douglas, geographer.

Classification.—The elevations are classified as precise or primary, according to the methods employed in their determination. The former are determined by lines of levels run either in both forward and backward directions or by simultaneous double-rodded lines, a high-grade instrument being used and special precautions being taken in observations and reduction to correct errors and make the line continuously good throughout. The latter or primary levels are determined with the Y level, precautions being taken against only the principal errors and the levels being run mostly in circuits of single lines. The allowable limit of error observed on the precise work already done by the Geological Survey in this State is represented

in feet by 0.03 \sqrt{D} and that for the primary work by 0.05 \sqrt{D} , in which D is the length of circuit in miles.

Bench marks.—The standard bench marks are of two forms. first form is a circular bronze or aluminum tablet (C and E, Pl. I), 3½ inches in diameter and ¼ inch thick, having a 3-inch stem, which is cemented in a drill hole in solid rock in the wall of some public building, a bridge abutment, or other substantial masonry structure. The second form (F, Pl. I), used where masonry or rock is not available, consists of a hollow wrought-iron post 3½ inches in outer diameter and 4 feet in length. It is split at the bottom and spread out to a width of 10 inches in order to give a firm bearing on the earth, and is set about 3 feet in the ground. A bronze or aluminum-bronze cap is riveted upon the top of the post. A third style of bench mark with abbreviated lettering (B and D, Pl. I), is used for unimportant This consists of a special copper nail 1½ inches in length driven through a copper washer $\frac{7}{8}$ inch in diameter. The tablets as well as the caps on the iron posts are appropriately lettered, and cooperation by States is indicated by the addition of the State name (G, Pl. I).

The number stamped on the bench marks described in the following pages represent the elevations to the nearest foot as determined by the levelman. These numbers are stamped with $\frac{3}{16}$ -inch steel dies on the tablets of post caps, to the left of the word "Feet." The office adjustment of the notes and the reduction to mean sea level datum may so change some of the figures that the original markings are 1 or 2 feet in error. It is assumed that engineers and others who have occasion to use the bench-mark elevations will apply to the Director of the United States Geological Survey, at Washington, D. C., for the adjusted values, and will use the markings as identification numbers only.

Datum.—All elevations determined by the United States Geological Survey and United States Coast and Geodetic Survey are referred to mean sea level, which is the level that the sea would assume if the influence of winds and tides were eliminated. This level is not the elevation determined from the mean of the highest and the lowest tides, nor is it the half sum of the mean of all the high tides and the mean of all the low tides, which is called the half-tide level. Mean sea level is the average height of the water, all stages of the tide being considered. It is determined from observations made by means of tidal gages placed at stations where local conditions, such as long, narrow bays, rivers, and like features, will not affect the height of the water. To obtain even approximately correct results these observations must extend over at least one lunar month, and if accuracy is desired they must extend over several years. At ocean stations the half-tide level and the mean sea level usually differ

but little. It is assumed that there is no difference between the mean sea levels determined from observations in the Atlantic Ocean, the Gulf of Mexico, and the Pacific Ocean.

The connection with tidal stations for bench marks in certain areas that lie at some distance from the seacoast is still uncertain, and this fact is indicated by the addition of a letter or word to the right of the word "Datum" on tablets or posts. For such areas corrections for published results will be made from time to time as the precise-level lines of the United States Geological Survey, the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey, or other Government organizations are extended.

Topographic maps.—Maps of the following quadrangles wholly or partly in North Carolina have been published by the United States Geological Survey up to July 1, 1916. The elevations in the following list are a portion of the results of a line of precise leveling begun in 1896 at Morehead City, N. C., and carried westward along the Norfolk Southern and the Southern railroads to Knoxville and Cleveland, Tenn., and to Brunswick, Ga. At Morehead City tide-gage readings were made during six lunar months in 1898 through the courtesy of the Superintendent of the Coast and Geodetic Survey. At Brunswick, Ga., tide-gage readings were made at St. Simons light at various times between 1854 and 1898 by the Coast and Geodetic Survey, and the elevations of several bench marks at Brunswick were determined from them through precise leveling by the Corps of Engineers, United States Army.

In 1899 E. L. McNair connected this line with the tide gage at Morehead City and with four tidal bench marks at Brunswick, Ga., one of which was discarded, and the mean closure error of this circuit of 1,043.2 miles at Brunswick was -1.057 feet. Cleveland and Knoxville are junction points with other links of the precise-level net, and the adjustment made by the Coast and Geodetic Survey in 1912 corrects the original results with respect to Morehead City as follows: Paint Rock, N. C., -0.351; Knoxville, Tenn., -0.452; Cleveland, Tenn., -0.189; Cahutta, Ga., -0.145; and Brunswick, Ga., +1.057. No adjustment was put between Morehead City and Selma because of the small divergence and flat country.

That portion of the entire line included in North Carolina was run in cooperation with the State and with certain railroads of the State, and the route was selected so as to cross every line of railway in the State.

The instruments employed on the section from Morehead City to Paint Rock were a high-grade Buff & Berger spirit level and two Gurley single-faced nonextensible rods 10 feet in length, made from selected white pine soaked in boiling paraffin. Rapid setting of the targets was accomplished by use of a steel tape passing over drums at each end of the rods. Two rodmen were employed setting on separate steel turning-point pins. The instrument was at all times protected from the wind and sun; fore and back sights were of equal length; no sights of over 300 feet were permitted except when unavoidable. One division of level vial used equaled about 8 seconds of arc. Four steel turning pins, two for each rodman, were so used that those

employed for backsights were not removed until the foresight pegs had been used. The limit of total divergence in feet was fixed at $0.42~\sqrt{\rm distance~from~Morehead~City~in~miles}$. The backsights were read first on one set of pins and last on the other set. The leveling in this State on this line was done in 1896 and 1897 by W. Carvel Hall.

The following is the North Carolina portion of the results of a spur of precise levels run in 1905 from Durham, N. C., north along the Southern Railway to Clarksville, Va. (See Bulletin 562.)

The method and limit of error were those now adopted by the Coast and Geodetic Survey in precise-level work. The line was leveled independently in both the forward and backward directions, broken by temporary bench marks into sections 2 to 3 kilometers long. On all sections upon which the backward and forward measures differed more than 4.0 millimeters \sqrt{K} (in which K is the distance in kilometers) leveled between adjacent bench marks both the forward and backward measures were repeated until they came within limits.

The instruments used were two self-reading rods, 3.2 meters in length graduated to centimeters and reading by estimation to millimeters; and a Coast and Geodetic Survey type precise level.

The party consisting of five persons was in charge of R. L. Libby, level man.


